



*Viminaria juncea*  
Swish Bush, Golden  
Spray; Shrub  
**Fabaceae**

This is a common tall, slender roadside shrub, but on the coast it looks quite different. Due to the relentless winds and salt spray it grows close to the ground on granite outcrops, with thick, densely branching stems.

Flowers: Nov. – Jan. ■



*Bossiaea linophylla*  
Shrub  
**Fabaceae**

This is the tallest of our *Bossiaea* species with a weeping habit, long narrow linear leaves, and a profusion of flowers in spring. Common in jarrah-marri forest and peppermint woodland

Flowers: Jul. – Nov. ■



*Bossiaea disticha*  
Shrub  
**Fabaceae**

Medium shrub, and one of the main understory plants in our karri forest and peppermint woodland. It has a very restricted range, however, being found only from Ellensbrook south to Augusta and generally west of Caves Road. Within these limits though, it is abundant, and a springtime delight along the Track. Its leaves are short and flowers are a little larger than those of *B. linophylla* (above).

Flowers: Aug. – Oct. ■

*Bossiaea ornata*  
Broad-leaved Brown Pea;  
Shrub  
**Fabaceae**

Low, open shrub with dark, ovate leaves and attractive yellow-brown flowers that are larger than those of the other *Bossiaea* species found here. Grows in sandy woodland.

Flowers: Sep. – Nov. ■



*Eutaxia virgata*  
Shrub  
**Fabaceae**

Prostrate or low, twiggly shrub growing in damp areas and peaty swamps. Look for it as you cross the little bridge on the Moses Rock section of the Track.

Flowers: Nov. – Jan.



*Pimelea suaveolens*  
Scented Banjine; Shrub  
**Thymelaeaceae**

Delicate low shrub with large, nodding flower heads that seem almost too big to be supported by their stems. It grows on gravelly, lateritic soils in open jarrah forest between Jurien Bay and Albany.

Flowers: Sept. – Oct.
